

## **Program/Event Intern**Summer (1 Position Available)

May – July 31 (starting date negotiable) | Full-time (30+ hours per week)

<u>Who</u>: Students majoring in adaptive sports, recreation, sport management/leisure studies, business administration, event management, therapeutic recreation or related field. All college levels are welcome to apply but juniors and seniors who need internship credit to graduate are strongly encouraged to apply.

Overview: As the statewide leader in sports and recreation opportunities for the population with physical disabilities, Adaptive Sports Iowa (ASI) will provide our interns with a unique and educational experience. Interns will have the opportunity to take part in all aspects of sports and recreation management from program design to event management as well as working with our athletes.

This internship opportunity will demand a lot but is guaranteed to provide outstanding real world experience. Our interns will be closely involved in all aspects of event management and tasked with significant responsibility. For over 50 years the state of lowa plays host to the *Registers' Annual Great Bike Ride Across Iowa* (RAGBRAI). Essentially it is the oldest and largest cycling event on the planet. Adaptive Sports Iowa organizes the only team within RAGBRAI that supports cyclists with physical disabilities. The team consists of roughly 80 people from many states and a wide variety of physical disabilities. The role of our summer intern will be to coordinate all aspects of our RAGBRAI team.

<u>Qualifications</u>: Must be organized and detailed oriented. Must have some skills with Microsoft Word and Excel. Must have an excellent work ethic and be able to work independently.

Job Description: The internship will focus on the planning and operations of ASI programs and events.

- Event coordination
- Participant outreach
- Volunteer correspondence
- Facility set-up/teardown
- Social media management

In addition the intern will assist in the operations of various ongoing ASI programs including wheelchair tennis, beep baseball, airgun, and community events.

<u>Why the Iowa Sports Foundation</u>: The internship will give you the opportunity to learn a great deal about not-for-profit sports and recreation entities. You will work with dedicated staff and gain insights of sport and event management.

Hours: Office hours will vary throughout the summer. Expect extended hours and weekend work leading up to RAGBRAI (July 20-27, 2024).
